In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

† CDC is no longer reporting the number of persons under investigation (PUIs) that have been tested, as well as PUIs that have tested negative. Now that states are testing and reporting their own results, CDC's numbers are not representative of all testing being done nationwide.



Membership Application and Dues Requirement

At our last Ski Club meeting, one of our members asked, "What do our annual Asheville Ski Club dues pay for?" Here's short list of what your \$35/\$60 provides.

- o Monthly meeting expenses
- o Membership dues in the Crescent Ski Council
- o Internet presence/Our Web site
- o The cost of attending the Spring and Fall Crescent Conferences for the trip leader, race leader and our club's representatives. (These club positions are required to attend both the Spring and Fall Conferences by the Crescent Council.)
- o Payment for our tax preparation
- o Administrative costs such as banking fees, PO Box storage fee, and accounting software
- o Liability insurance for our club

As a nonprofit organization, we do not make a profit. Our dues and fundraising equal the amount that we spend. If we have an auction, the proceeds are passed through to support Special Winter Olympics or the race team. Our fund raising always has a specific and advertised purpose. Right now we are on track for our dues to cover our expenses so that we can continue to have fun skiing together.

Your annual ski club dues should be paid by November 1 each year. All present and future members must annually fill out an application form and pay the fee simultaneously by each November monthly meeting. The membership chair will accept membership payments and application forms at any monthly meeting from March through November.

You can apply for membership and/or pay your dues by going to the membership link on the club's website: ashevilleskiclub.com. Then make a choice:

- · Print out, complete and mail the membership form with your check, or
- Pay by credit card by selecting the type of membership.

If you are planning to race or participate in an Asheville Ski Club or a Crescent Ski Council trip, you must be a current member. Our club sends part of your membership dues to the Crescent Ski Council which provides some insurance on trips and gives each member access to the many programs and benefits.

Medical Form Requirement

For each trip, all trip participants must fill out a medical form and put it in an envelope with your name on the outside. Seal it, bring it on your trip and give it to your trip leader when you arrive on location. This is solely to help you in case of emergency. If not used, we will either return it to you or destroy it. This form appears on our website: ashevilleskiclub.com by clicking on Trips then Medical Form.

And last is the early April spring break trip, which may very well be the best spring break trip of your life (and your children or grandchildren) because it is to Mount Bachelor in Bend, Oregon. This trip will fall exactly over the Easter break for young people in Asheville, Buncombe County, and several other school districts. Mt. Bachelor is known for getting tons of snow and having the longest ski season in the country. It doesn't close until the end of May even though the days are sunny and relatively warm.

Brace Yourself for the Best Spring Break Ever!

What do Asheville City Schools, Buncombe County Schools, Transylvania County Schools, Macon County Schools, Henderson County Traditional Schools and McDowell County Traditional Schools have in common?

They all have their spring break April 3-10, 2021 (Easter is April 4, 2021) and that's the week the Asheville Ski Club has booked Mt. Bachelor, Oregon—the Best of the Far West! Mt. Bachelor is 4,300 acres of the driest snow in the Cascade Mountain Range and since it gets so much snow, it stays open until the end of May! Sometimes they reopen just for the Fourth of July.

But the real beauty is that spring skiing is the best. No heavy layers, no frostbite or cold fingers and toes. Ski in the morning and ride bikes in the evening. Days are long and sunny (Bend gets 300 days of sunshine a year in its high desert location).

We'll be staying in Bend with a car assigned to every group of four so that you can get out and enjoy all there is to do. And there is a lot! Hiking, rock climbing, road bikes and mountain bikes (and family bikes that hold up to four people), fishing, golfing, snow-shoeing, Nordic skiing, dog sledding, sleigh rides, canoeing, sightseeing, shopping, arts tours, brewery tours (Bend has been named Beer City three times), and so much more.

Bend is 20 miles from Mt. Bachelor, but will have daytime highs in the mid to high 50s. The elevation is just 3,600 feet, making sleeping easy. Mt. Bachelor has a base elevation of 5,700 feet and a summit of just 8,222 feet. Bend is so similar to Asheville that you'll feel right at home. The population is almost identical to Asheville at 91,000. Our hotel offers family suites and complimentary bicycles for riding around Bend and along the Deschutes River that runs through town. Or drive a bit further to Crater Lake and snowshoe with a ranger (no charge) to learn about the area.

This is a trip you'll love, so bring the kids, grandkids, grandparents - there's something for everyone! Plus, we've added in fun things like a snowblast snowtubing party, on-mountain lunch, group photo, and more.

I'll be telling you more about this great trip soon, but in the meantime, why not go to visitbend.com and request a free Visitor Guide? It won't cost you a thing and you can get busy planning a fantastic Easter vacation.
