
Newsletter Editor's Notes

STEAMBOAT SKI AND RACE CAMP 2021

What an unusual trip and year. Asheville started out with 38 registered trip participants, but due to a lack of snow, cancellation of kid's program, and full refunds on lessons and lifts, we ended up with 31 people on the trip. Several new members signed up for this trip. CSC had 269 registered and ended up with 204......participants were ready to see their old friends and make new ones. Over half of the entire group were first timers which tells you a lot about the trip.

Despite the lack of snow and only having 5 runs available, instructors delivered top notch instruction with an opportunity to work on more technical components than had all the slopes been open. Even though racers only had "stubbies" to race around, new skills were learned and other skills were refined. A "first" this year was a night race rather than the normal day race. Only CSC was allowed on the slopes and lifts for the race. Turner Foster was the only one from Asheville that raced!

All the social events were held and the group stayed in new lodging- Trappeur's Crossing! New also was the private sale hosted by SteamboatTorian Sports.

The BBQ Dinner and Dance was held at the top of Thunderhead....delicious food and great music by house band SunDog! This was their first gig since 2020 and they were excited it was with CSC. Several of our members walked away with door prizes.

The Farewell Awards Dinner was a success as usual....some from our clubwalked away with great door prizes!

Steamboat is undergoing major renovations and expansion.....next yearphase 1 of a second gondola will be open, new terrain and more snowmaking, an ice skating rink will be ready.....stay tuned!

A Fresh, New Winter Season at Sugar Mountain Resort

Sugar Mountain Ski Resort, North Carolina – Tuesday, October 12, 2021 – The falling leaves, brisk days, and nightly temperatures near freezing are tantalizing reminders that a fresh, new winter season is quickly approaching and Sugar Mountain Resort's improvements and upgrades will tease the snow enthusiast even more.

This season, at Sugar Mountain Resort, a new four-passenger, Doppelmayr lift will carry snow seekers midway up Sugar Mountain's east side. The brand new 2,000 foot long, fixed grip chairlift, renamed the <u>Big Birch chairlift</u>, services the Big Birch slope, and provides access to Oma's Meadow. It replaces the former triple Green chairlift and is the Resort's fourth installation in six years.

Five additional, fully automated SMI snow making machines outfitted along the tree line on Oma's Meadow will compliment Mother Nature's supply of winter's wonderful white stuff and aim to open the locals' favorite slope sooner than later. An innovative, 600W Piston Bully Winch Cat will replace an aging replica and ensure a reliable fleet combs the ski slopes an imperial carpet of corduroy, twice, every single day.

When guests pull up by car or bus to Sugar Mountain Resort, the familiar frost heaves and frozen ruts of the past will barely be remembered as visitors drive over the newly paved entrance and parking lots around the base lodge.

Andreas Griesbauer, a native of the Bavarian city of Neuburg on the Donau in Germany, joins the Sugar Mountain Resort <u>team</u> this autumn as the company's graphic designer and information technology manager. Before joining Sugar Mountain Resort, Andreas worked for Tyrolean Airlines, Binder Metal Goods, and the Austrian ski resort Gschwanfkopf Lifte Seefeld. He is replacing Florian Kasper, who is leaving the company to develop his own business.

All that is new this season at Sugar Mountain Resort are welcome signs that a fresh, new winter season is upon us.

It proceeded to list resorts every skier should ski at least once in a lifetime. I was delighted and amazed that I had skied every one of them! But the beauty lay in the fact that 11 of the 12 resorts I had gone to as a result of being a member of the Asheville Ski and Outing Club.

Here are the 12 resorts "you simply must do if you are a skier."

- 1. Kitzbuhel, Austria
- 2. Chamonix, France
- 3. Jackson Hole, Wyoming
- 4. Val D'Isere, France
- 5. Cortina, Italy
- 6. Banff, Canada
- 7. Niseko, Japan
- 8. St. Anton, Austria
- 9. St. Moritz, Switzerland
- 10. Les 3 Vallees, France
- 11. Whistler, Canada
- 12. Zermatt, Switzerland

I have led groups to seven of the 12. To be fair, I don't know if we went to Niseko, Japan. There are as many little ski resorts as there are islands and only one of the three or four I went to that I remember was Hakuba, but since I don't plan to ever go back, I'm counting it. The other five resorts I went as a participant and not a leader.

How many have you been to, and how many would you like to go to? Now is a good time to let trip leaders know. Many clubs have already made contracts with resorts for 2023. Don't just tell the trip leaders you are interested. Tell them when you prefer to go (ie. only in January; only during spring school break, etc.) and how many people you could also talk into going.

There are some resorts I would have added to the list. My all-time favorite ski resort was the Sella Ronda in Italy. And Briancon, France was stunningly beautiful. Vail (though incredibly expensive now) was fun, but the United States has many really nice resorts. The club always does several domestic trips.

And don't forget the trips for non-skiers! Our bike and boat trip through four countries on the Danube River during Octoberfest was great. We also have a small group adventure going to Machu Pichu with a few spots still open.

Now is the time to let your wants be known! Speak up, talk among yourselves, and let the Trips Committee (or one of its members, or the club President or VP) know what you would sign up for if it were only offered.



"California Dreaming"

One of the coolest things about skiing Heavenly in South Lake Tahoe is skiing from California into Nevada and back. As you are skiing along the mountain ridge, you look down one side and see spectacular views of Lake Tahoe with its beautiful deep blue water against the pure white snow. Then you look on the other side into Nevada's desert, with the striking difference all the more obvious.

Heavenly is the highest and biggest resort in Lake Tahoe, with 4,800 acres of pistes, four freestyle parks, widely spaced tree skiing (reportedly the best tree skiing in North America), snowmaking on 70% of its pistes to make the resort snow sure, great nightlife, and plenty of skiing for every level of skier.
