Until March 19, 2008 it was one of four ski resorts in America to prohibit snow boarding. The Kachina lift, constructed in 2014, serves one of the highest elevations of any triple chair in the North American Continent, to a peak elevation of 12,481 feet. ITINERARY

September 9, depart Asheville on overnight flight arriving in Munich September 10, 2019

Day 1 Krimml (no biking)

Meet your guide at the Munich Airport and transfer by bus to the village of Krimml, located in the province of Salzburg. On arrival, we'll fit your bicycle to you and test your bicycling skills to be sure that you are ready for your adventure ahead. Join us tonight for our welcome dinner.

Day 2 Krimml (hiking/no biking)

Start the day with an excursion to the Krimmler waterfalls, a spectacle that can be watched from close up by way of a footpath. Enjoy the sensational views of the roaring falls from numerous vantage points and platforms along the trail. The waterfall drops from a height of 1470 meters in three immense steps, making it the fifth highest waterfall in the world. Late this afternoon, attend a lecture on safety, rules of the road and the IBT corner system that will prepare you for the days to come.

Day 3 Niedernsill (29 miles)

Mount your bicycle for your first ride along the Salzach River to Niedernsill. Bicycle through an area known as the Pinzgau, which extends eastward from the Gerlos Pass to the Gasteiner Tal, bounded on the north by the Kitzbühel Alps and on the south by the Hohe Tauern National Park. The scenery is spectacular as your pedal on dedicated bicycle trails through quaint villages and flower-filled fields to Niedernsill.

Day 4 Leogang (32 miles)

Depart for Kaprun, a busy ski area, known for its reservoirs and glaciers. During a visit to the Tauernkraft power plant, discover the engineering feats mastered to harness the power of the glacial waters. Weather permitting, explore the Sigmund Thun Klamm on a wooden walkway overlooking the beautiful gorge, formed by the melting waters of the Hohe Tauern glaciers during the last ice age. Our cycling brings us to the town of Zell am See, a popular lakeside resort, where we will have time for lunch and exploration. We continue to Leogang, following the twists and turns of the rivers Salzach and Saalach. The Austrians have built a vast network of bicycle trails next to the rivers, making bicycling even more tranquil in an already very serene setting.

Day 5 Lofer (26 miles)

This should be a special day: according to the map (let's hope it is an accurate one) it is all downhill.... We are cycling on wonderfully quiet back roads with beautiful scenery and villages out of fairy tales to our destination, Lofer. Weather-permitting, hop into a cable car to ascend to the Lofer Alm, where the vistas of the Lower Saalach Valley are magnificent. There will be ample time following this excursion to explore the picturesque village of Lofer with its wonderful alpine architecture.

Day 6 Salzburg (34 miles)

Our route will take us through Bad Reichenhall, known for its health spas and salt production. Descend into the extensive network of tunnels and caves of the "Alte Saline" Saltworks below Castle Gruttenstein to learn how salt is extracted from brine. After lunch, we'll continue on to Salzburg, the city of Mozart, and our home for the next two nights.

Day 7 Salzburg (no biking/walking tour of the city)

After a hearty breakfast, we're off to join a local historian for a guided walk of the old town of Salzburg. The rest of the day is yours: explore the castle, the cathedral, sample some pastries on a terrace or just relax by the river.

Day 8 Burghausen (33 miles)

Our direction is north as we follow the Salzach. The Austrian who thought of building all the great bicycle trails certainly deserves an award: it is the most tranquil bicycling one could wish for. And when you are thirsty or hungry, a five-minute departure from the trail brings you to a village with shops and cafes. Our highlight today is the village of Oberndorf where the "Silent Night, Holy Night" carol was composed. Late afternoon we cross the border into Germany and stop in Burghausen for the night.

Day 9 Kirchdorf (15 miles)

The Inn River is our guiding light for this day as we head northeast. Before we leave Burghausen with its pastel-colored homes on the square, we visit the castle, the longest in Europe (1034 meters) complete with towers and bridges. We'll be bicycling on the Austrian side of the river to our final destination Kirchdorf, literally translated as "church village," one of the many villages in Germany and Austria that bears this name. Join your guide for the farewell dinner.

Day 10 Departure

Board a coach for the group transfer to Munich Airport and our flight back to Asheville.

ASC Racing Report (Erik Sandstedt)

What a great season for Asheville's race team!

First place in the eastern division again and most points overall. Our racers are improving their skills with every race and we are seeing new racers for almost every race weekend. The weather has been with us this season, even if we've had some warm and wet days. We have 50 racers that qualified for Crescent Cup, our final race for the season in Snowshoe/Silver creek.

Asheville skiers, with Doug McMillan as our inspiring leader have put in lots of effort to improve the safety level during our races. Many members have put in time and effort to bring, put up and take down safety nets during our races, and hopefully started a new trend where the ski resorts will make it safer for our ski racers. One of our goals for next season is that we can create more weekly training opportunities for our racers.

Thank you everyone that makes this part of the club fantastic, fun and a foundation to create good skiers for life.

CSC Racing Report (Ron Scott)

We have held two races since the last President's update. On January 5th and 6th we raced at Sugar Mountain. Gunther Jochl, owner and manager, spent approximately two hours pushing snow into Big Birch to prepare a race course for our Crescent race. Despite the warm ambient temperatures Sugar was able to provide a very high quality and fun race course for our racers. Sugar's race crew that weekend consisted of seven members who set, salted, maintained and assisted in scoring and starting. No other resort would or could have accomplished what Sugar did that weekend to provide a race course for Crescent Racing.

January 26th and 27th Crescent Racing was bashing the gates at Appalachian Mountain. The total number of racers, excluding qualifiers, for Slalom was 120. The total qualified racers for Giant Slalom on Sunday was 134. Conditions for our race were fantastic. The sun was out and the temperatures were cool. Very little salt was applied to the groomed race course surface. We had a weekend of racing that was fun for all and the smiles on racer's faces were as big as the sun was bright. What a joy it is to see our young Crescent racers and their parents enjoying each other, the outdoors and Crescent Racing.


