



This season is winding down but we're already thinking about next year. Sports America is excited to offer some pretty great perks to both clubs & individuals who choose to promote & purchase both Epic & Ikon Passes. The best deals are happening now!

Where do you buy them?

How much do they cost?

We will always sell the price for the exact same amount as booking direct. No added credit card fees, no discounts.

You can choose to add the protection plan (recommended!) when buying from us.

What are the perks?

Sports America is going to give back 6.5% of the pass revenue to the guests & clubs! Guests who purchase the passes will get a trip credit of either \$50 or \$30 depending on which product they purchase. Full Ikon & Epic Pass purchases will receive \$50 off their trip. Ikon Base pass, Epic Local/Tahoe/Summit passes will receive \$30 off their trip.

ADDITIONALLY, the CLUB which that guest is affiliated with (will be declared at the time of purchase) will receive the leftover revenue kickback.

So if a guest buys a full Ikon pass for \$949 - that guest will get a \$50 trip credit. 6.5% of \$949 is \$61.68. Deduct the \$50 given to the guest, and the club earns \$11.68!

Revenue will be calculated on the PASS price (not including insurance premiums).

Should a guest buy a pass from us and NOT end up attending a trip organized by Sports America we will issue that guest a credit in the earned amount to Amazon. Guest cannot choose an Amazon credit instead of a trip credit. Amazon credits are only applied if they do not travel with us and will be issued once pass sales close in early December 2019. Club Revenue will be issued once pass sales close in early December.

EXTRA IKON PERKS ----

Ikon has set up a special 'group' promotion for 1st time pass purchasers. Anyone who buys a pass at the above link by April 24th will qualify to get that pass at the same discounted price that guests who are renewing their pass get. It's basically \$30 cheaper than the published pass price.

So, whether you're renewing a pass, or buying for the first time, the BEST deal is to buy before April 24th.

Certainly, let me know if you have any questions. I'm happy to answer. I know many of you are still planning your trips - but the best deals are now so I wanted to get this info out asap!



50th Anniversary Spring Convention Report 2019

CSC continued celebrating their 50th Anniversary with 247 participants in North Myrtle Beach, Kingston Plantation. Attending for Asheville were Paul Dobson, Margaret Crum, David Harrison and Denise Ball.

Events included the Early Bird Dessert Function, Thursday night featuring desserts, beverages, and a live band that happened to be playing at our venue, The Whiskey Beach Bar and Grill. Friday events included Golf, Tennis, Mini Golf tournaments, Trade Show, club history booths and DJ Dance Party. Paul Dobson's golf foursome came in 1st for lowest team score, finally beating ETMM. Margaret's team came in 1st in Mini-Golf. Saturday events included the Trips, Racing, Website meetings, Incredible Beach Olympics, DJ Dance, Champagne and cake. Paul and myself came in 2nd in Ladder Ball. ETMM continued their dominance, winning the 2019 Beach Olympics with Palmetto placing 2nd! Maybe next year.....

CSC TRIPS FOR 2019 AND 2020

JUNE 1 is the beginning sign up date for CSC TRIPS. Below are the dates and important info that you need to know.

DECEMBER 7-14 STEAMBOAT SKI/BOARD AND RACE CAMP

****Early Bird ONLINE sign up begins June 1 for the first 70 people.....\$1198... after the first 70, lodging increases significantly due to management and The Lodge HOA .Tour op has no control of HOA etc., DO NOT PROCRASTINATE as you may end up without a condo.

IANUARY 11-18, 2020 SUN PEAKS RESORT, BRITISH COLUMBIA

This is the 2nd largest ski resort in Canada, 4000 acres. Lots of non skiing activities (hockey games, ice skating, cross country, sleigh rides etc), 22 seats out of Greenville on United at \$323! All lodging is ski-in, ski-out. ONLINE REGISTRATION BEGINS JUNE 1.

MARCH 17-25, 2020 GRANADA AND SIERRA NEVADA SPAIN WITH TOURREMOLINOS Costa del Sol (beach) and extensions to LISBON PORTUGAL (March 14-18) and BARCELONA (March 25-28).

This trip is being run by Holidaze (they ran club trip to Japan) This is considered an adventure trip for the council. Skiing is optional, daily tour packages (Gibraltar, Cordoba, Alahambra, Alpujarra, Nerja -just to name a few -will be available). You can basically do all 3 components of the trip, or just 1.....lots of choices! REGISTRATION WILL BEGIN JUNE 1 and at this point there is no online registration... hopefully, they may have it up and running.

At this time, there are no trip leaders for the January and March trip. If Asheville does not have a trip leader then you may sign up with any other club in CSC...suggestion would be Palmetto or ETMM. Wayne Bailey, is now Trip Leader of Asheville and he will be your main contact.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE MEETING:

- 1. Given the changes at The Lodge, the Trips Committee voted to allow Lisa Beregi and SAT to begin looking a other properties for 2021.
- 2. SAT has a domestic contract with United Airlines...this means they can off fares about 1/3 or more off posted prices of airlines. You do not have to be a group to get this rate....individuals are encourage to check with SAT before booking.
- 3. IKON passes, only are still available through SAT and club will be a percentage kickback plus a trip credit.
- 4. Trip leaders were reminded that trip participants must be a club member: if not, non-members are not covered by any insurance/liability policy a club may have; if audited by the IRS, and non members are identified, a club can be fined huge penalties. they are then viewed as a tour operator and not a non-profit club Chattanooga Ski Club had this happened to them and the penalties were HUGE!
- 5. CSC is looking for suggestions for an adventure trip in 2022. Where would you like to go? what would you like to do? Skiing does not have to be a component. Cruises, biking, multi-adventure.....you name! Send written suggestion to either Wayne Bailey or myself.

RACE WORKERS MEETING

David Harrison represented ASC at this meeting. The only thing I have to report is at the BOD meeting on Sunday, Race Chair, Ron Scott, gave out the following stats:

Ages 12-15 made up the largest number of racers (which included a huge group for Asheville); next was 54-60 yrs. David will provide more specifics to our Race Director.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING SUNDAY

Highlights of this meeting were voting on "clean-ups" in the bylaws; officer elections and a big reminder of Dues being paid on time. Asheville was 1 of 5 clubs that did not pay their dues in a timely manner. They were due December 1 and were not received until March 31. More specific info will be passed on to our President, Past President, Treasurer and Board.
