


I starting skiing around 1985.

Beech Mountain Resort's Installation of TWO New Chairlifts Will Decrease Travel Time, Increase Capacity to Summit and Riding Comfort

Beech Mountain, NC—Beech Mountain Ski Resort announces the replacement of two of its main chairlifts, to be ready for the 2018/2019 winter season. Lift 5, which ascends to the 5,506-foot summit, and was originally built in 1987, is currently being disassembled in preparation for the installment of a new Doppelymayr fixed-grip quad lift. The Doppelmayr quad lift will include the addition of a loading conveyor to ensure safe boarding, higher travel speeds and shorter trip times. Lift 5 will now offer 144 chairs with a 6-1/2-minute travel time accommodating 2,400 people per hour.

Lift 6, currently a double chair lift, also ascends to the 5,506-foot summit and will be replaced with an identical Doppelmayr fixed-grip quad lift. This new Doppelmayr quad lift will feature 106 chairs offering a 6-1/2-minute travel time with a capacity of 2,000 people per hour.

Both Doppelmayr quad lifts will feature foot support with upholstered seating and a back rest. Patrons can now expect to reach the 5,506-foot summit with easy on/off loading, comfortable seating, and a more efficient layout to eliminate line congestion.

Beech Mountain Resort will open for summer operations soon, including mountain biking, disc golf, live music, and yoga. Transportation will be provided to the summit and more information will be released in April.

Everyone in Vermont wanted to know how we picked the best week of the year two years ago. Please ask any participant about the trip. We were treated great at the Killington Grand, Okemo and Mt. Snow!

Make sure Clubs discuss where they would like to go in 2020, including how interested they are in Spain for March 2020 so their trip leaders can vote appropriately at the Trip meeting during Spring Convention. Thanks to all the Club Trip Leaders and each participant for a great year.

As you know, both the EPIC & IKON Passes went on sale March 6th. Lisa received a very good question this week about the EPIC Pass and how much if you buy one you would save on the Crested Butte January Ski Week. Although we haven't finalized the Crested Butte pricing, the lift ticket portion will be the same. 5-day lift ticket included in the package is \$214, so if one has the EPIC pass, they can deduct that amount from the trip. Remember, if you buy your EPIC pass from SAT you will get an additional \$30 or \$50 off the trip depending on which pass you purchase.

The only flexible component to that price is we will be offering a Monarch Day Trip during the week at an additional day trip fee. So - if one wanted to go to Monarch but only ski 5 days total, they would only be purchasing a 4-day Crested Butte ticket and the savings would be less.


