Steamboat Ski School and Race Camp 2017

34 ASC members (8 new memberships, 2 lapsed renewals) participated in Crescent's annual trip and what an interesting trip it was. November was mild and relatively dry in the Yampa Valley, but Steamboat Ski Area reported 10 inches of fresh powder at mid-mountain Monday, December 4, after an overdue storm glided into the valley on the heels of a brisk wind the night before.



In the early morning hours Monday, Steamboat Ski Area employed a record 146 snow-making guns and ran 3.1 million gallons of water through them to take advantage of ideal snowmaking conditions. And all of that manmade snow mixed with a blast of natural powder. The locals always look forward to CSC coming into town as we tend to bring the snow!



An unusual inversion of temperatures made snow making impossible from Thunderhead so the mountain could not be connected to open more runs. Considering what Steamboat had to work with, groomers did a good job and lessons went on with a few challenges. Having 1/3 of Heavenly Daze open for the first run of the day was interesting. Jess' Cut Off to Vogue was the 2nd leg of the journey to the base. Racers managed to train on Vogue and Sitz and Bashor opened for the big race on Friday.

Asheville members who won medals were Ron James, a Bronze, Lou James, Silver, Michael Ferrell, Silver and Justin Laing, Gold. For those of you that don't know, Justin is the grandson of Jean and Doug Alden. He still holds the record for the lowest CSC handicap ever! Interesting that the medal winners aren't on the race team and live out of state!

Despite the lack of snow, members had a fantastic week of private sales, parties, dinners, dances, prizes and fun! 14 members won prizes at the Awards Dinner on Friday. The two youngest members on the trip, James Crum 5, and Bentley Laing, 7 had lessons all week and the lack of snow didn't bother them in the least! I think if we all had learned at

that early age, we would be "Olympians" as Billy likes to tell us! Our "Golden boy" of the group, Henry Herring (Gail's husband) just didn't get that warm, fuzzy feeling about skiing. He gets an A for effort though!

2018 will be Crescent"s 35th Anniversary Ski/Race School. Don't let this year's lack of snow prevent you from coming next year! Of those 19 years I have been coming, I have had powder lessons the entire week on more than one occasion....you just never know what you will get!!

Asheville Ski Club Ski Team

The ASC ski team is a group of fun loving mountain families that cherish outdoor activities and friendship. During the winter, we ski. While the mountains of North Carolina may not offer 12,000 foot peaks, epic terrain, or deep powder they do offer opportunities to have a ball on skis.



We have learned that ski racing is one of the best ways to make the most out of 300 vertical feet. Our club racers have also learned the racing is the best way to become a highly skilled skier. ASC formed a ski team so that we could take full advantage of the opportunities in our own back yard. Pictures are from Appalachian Mountain December 2017. See results next pages.



The 3 components of club success

Proximity: Skiing is always a big effort. One of the biggest issues that deter skiers from heading to the hill is drive time. We are developing our program at Wolf Ridge Ski Resort. It is an easy 35 minute drive from Asheville.

Cost: Unfortunately, Skiing can become very expensive very quickly. As a group, our club is able to negotiate lower pricing for slope access, gear, and training. (pricing details below)

Safety: Risk of injury is a part of skiing. That risk can, however, be mitigated. Through our program, we will teach the kids to identify the risks on the hill including other skiers and boarders as well as problematic terrain features. We spend much of our time on terrain that is closed to the public or, at least, minimally used. We will also teach them to ski with great control. Control is the most critical element of successful racing.

Oh yeah, and skiing is FUN! While we do enjoy racing, skiing and snowboarding are recreational activities. It can be more or less competitive depending on the kid. To be clear, the adult coaches are not working towards some "result". Our overall goal is to see the kids improve their skills and make progress on snow. Success is measured by enthusiasm, progression of personal skills, formation of new friendships, and big smiles under oversized goggles!







Asheville Ski Club Ski Team 3 levels of participation

ASC Practice Skier:

By joining the Asheville Ski Club kids and adults are eligible to buy a discounted lift ticket at Wolf Ridge for \$200 per individual (regardless of age). The club fee is \$60 for a family. Individual club memberships are also available for less. Practice skiers may attend practice on Monday and Wednesday nights. Practices run from 6:00 until 8:00. Free skiing at Wolf is also available on an unlimited basis. This is "step 1" to getting involved.



Crescent Racer:

Crescent is our sweet spot. Crescent racers are typically enthusiastic, intermediate to expert skiers. We travel to weekend races at other resorts in North Carolina and West Virginia. The competition is friendly and low key. Camaraderie is abundant. The racing format groups similarly skilled skiers into groups of 10 (a flight). Out of each flight, awards are given for the top three finishers.

SARA Racer:

This is our competitive offering. Some of the more experienced racers will attend races sponsored by the Southern Appalachian Racing Association. "SARA" is an affiliate of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association. Races are conducted according to national rules and showcase very talented racers. We have several members who participate and do very well.

ONLY 3 steps!

1. Join ASC, http://www.ashevilleskiclub.com/forms/MembForm.pdf

The costs and mailing address are on the form. (One note: the "racer fee" is only for those who want to participate in Crescent races.)

2. Buy an ASC Wolf Ridge lift pass:

Go to the Wolf Ridge Group Sales office on the top floor of the lodge and ask for an *ASC ski* team season pass. They are ONLY \$200 – a bargain that is hard to beat!

Asheville Ski Club Ski Team Additional Notes

**Crescent Racers: In addition to the steps above, Crescent racers must mail in the Crescent Race fee. A \$35 check payable to <u>The Asheville Ski Club</u> (and can be included with the membership check) - the cost is \$35 per racer regardless of age.

Once you pay your fee you are eligible for all Crescent races. Simply notify Coach Doug or Coach Erik Sandstedt (sweski@gmail.com) at least one week before a posted race and you will be added to the roster. We will give out race day information once you sign up. Don't worry - we will walk you through everything.

SARA Racers: To participate in SARA you must become a member of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association. Register through the website: https://usskiandsnowboard.org. You should register as an alpine competitor and associate with the Asheville Ski Club. The site will walk you through the steps. Once you do this, communicate with Coach Doug about participating in each race. This is a fun option for racers with a season or two of racing under their belt. It is not a good option for new racers!
